Young singer brings movie shoot to Fort

A young singer/songwriter is trying to bring her dreams to life with a movie being shot in Downtown Fort Saskatchewan.

Cara Albo is the star and executive producer with Skyline Motion Pictures, a company she helped to form in 2005. She hopes to use "Cat's Cradle" as a vehicle for her music, which will form the soundtrack for the show.

The 20-year-old Albo will be playing the role of a 21-year-old singing star who gets tired singing bubble gum music and runs away from Hollywood, only to have her car break down in a small town.

Other names to look for in the film include another Edmontonian, Brad Kelly, Brody Harms, and Denny Hoff, from Los Angeles and Fort Saskatchewan Mayor Jim Sheasgreen. Other local actors have also been hired.

The film's director is Gilbert Allan, who has a number of films, commercials and Alberta motion picture awards to his credit. He also teaches acting and motion picture production at Concordia University College, Taylor University and The King's University College.

Skyline Motion Pictures will be shooting "Cats Cradle" at a number of Fort locations, including Roadreddy Auto, the Fort Hotel, Auntie Sue's, Decor Divas, Flo's Beauty Salon, the museum and the Dow Centennial Centre.

Skyline executive producer Darren Dahlseide, is a Fort resident and suggested the locations to the team.

Shooting will continue until August.
